On the 23rd of June, 1969, came on to be heard by the Commissioners' Court of Fort Bend County, Texas, at a regular meeting of such Court, the application of Lucy Lois Roach, Frank P. Langston and wife, Frances Lois Langston, as Petitioners, for cancellation of a portion of Meyer and Pleak Subdivision, according to the subdivision thereof recorded in Volume 36, page 330 of the Deed Records of Fort Bend County, Texas, to which refer, so as to throw said portion of said subdivision back into acreage as it existed before such subdivision was made, said application having been heretofore filed with the Court on 2nd day of June, 1969, all of which is more fully shown of record in the Minutes of the Commissioners' Court of Fort Bend County, Texas, and it appearing to the Commissioners' Court that notice of such application has been duly published in The Herald-Coaster for three (3) weeks prior to this date as required by law; that such notice contained a copy of the Application filed hereon on the 2nd day of June, 1969; that such notice commanded any person interested in such portion of Meyer and Pleak Subdivision to appear in the Commissioners' Courtroom in the Fort Bend County Courthouse in Richmond, Texas, at 2:00 P. M. on this date to protest if desired against cancelling said portion of Meyer and Pleak Subdivision; that affidavit of publisher filed herein shows that such notice was duly published in The Herald-Coaster in the issues dated June 2, 1969, June 9, 1969, and June 16, 1969.

And it further appearing to the Commissioners' Court that such cancellation will not interfere with the established rights of any purchaser owning property covered by said original purported subdivision of Meyer and Pleak Subdivision and that an order should be issued authorizing said petitioners to cancel said portion of Meyer and Pleak Subdivision by written instrument recorded in the Deed Records of Fort Bend County, Texas.

Long League, Abstract No. 55, Simon Jones Labor, Abstract No. 271, and the R. E. Handy Survey, Abstract No. 187, situated in Fort Bend County, Texas, and being more particularly described by metes and bounds as follows:

Beginning at a two inch pipe in the Southwesterly right of way of the G. C. & S. F. R. R. Co., where same intersects the Southerly line of the Jane H. Long Survey and the Northerly line of the Simon Jones Labor as now fenced and recognized upon the ground said corner being South 55° 59' West a distance of 50.0 feet from the center line of the G. Long Survey and the Northerly line of the Simon Jones Labor and entering Lot No. 4 of the Meyer and Pleak Subdivision and at 3190.4 feet in all to a two inch pipe, the Southwesterly corner of this tract and the Southeasterly corner of the said Tom Bounds 200 acre tract in the Northerly side of a 40 foot dirt road;

THENCE South 64° 09' East with the Northerly side of said road a distance of 299.0 feet to a corner post, said corner being the Northeasterly corner of road enclosure where said road turns Southwesterly;

THENCE South 24° 57' West, with Easterly side of said road 37.9 feet to a corner post, the Southwesterly corner of fence jog enclosure;

THENCE South 64° 11' East with the Southerly line of Lots 4 and 5 of the said Meyer and Pleak Subdivision as now fenced and recognized upon the ground, a distance of 3149.1 feet to a two inch pipe, the Southeasterly corner of this tract said corner being in the Westerly side of a gravel road (Mennonite Road);

THENCE North 25° 24' East with the Westerly side of said road as now fenced at 50.0 feet cross the center of a canal and at 2063.4 feet in all to a stake in the Southerly right of way of the G. C. & S. F. R. R. on a curve;

R. right of way following a curve to the right, having a central angle of 25° 30' and a radius of 5977.2 feet and a theoretical length around said curve of 2660.2 feet to a two inch pipe, the point of tangent, an interior corner of this tract;

# RE: CONTRACT FOR COMPILING A DELINQUENT TAX RECORD

SUPPLEMENT FOR FORT BEND COUNTY, TEXAS
THE STATE OF TEXAS
COUNTY OF FORT BEND KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS:
WHEREAS, Article 7336f, Vernon's Revised Civil Statutes of Texas, requires that the Assessor-Collector of Taxes shall cause to be compiled a delinquent tax record; and,
WHEREAS, Article 7336f further requires that the Assessor-Collector of Taxes shall cause to be prepared a two year supplement, or a recompilation, when as many as two years taxes have become delinquent which are not shown on the delinquent tax record of his county; and,
WHEREAS, the Assessor-Collector of Taxes for Fort Bend County, Texas deems it necessary and expedient to contract with a competent firm to compile said delinquent tax record supplement under his supervision; and,
WHEREAS, C. R. Law Tax Records, Inc., with its principal office in Austin, Travis County, Texas, is engaged in and now does such work and represents that it is fully equipped, competent and capable of performing the above desired work and is willing and ready to perform said work in accordance with the provisions of law, rulings of the Comptroller of Public Accounts, Austin, Texas and suggestions of the Assessor-Collector of Taxes for Fort Bend County, Texas; and,
WHEREAS, after having made careful investigation of C. R. Law Tax Records, Inc. and after having considered the same, the Assessor-Collector of Taxes forFort_BendCounty, Texas desires to enter into contract with the said C. R. Law Tax Records, Inc., for compiling a delinquent tax recordsupplementfor the years1967to1968, both inclusive.
NOW THEREFORE, this contract made and entered into by and between Mrs. Betty J. Hanzelka  Assessor-Collector of Taxes for Fort Bend County, Texas hereinafter called "Collector" and C.R. Law  Tax Records, Inc., hereinafter called "Contractor."
WITNESSETH:
- 1 -  Collector agrees to employ and does hereby employ Contractor to compile a delinquent tax record_supple -
ment for Fort Bend County, Texas for the years 1967 to 1968, both inclusive, showing all the unredeemed, uncancelled delinquent taxes remaining charged on the official delinquent tax records and delinquent lists of Fort Bend County, Texas for said years.
- <b>- 2 -</b>
The general arrangement and set up of the record shall be made as required by law, rulings of the Comptroller of Public Accounts, Austin, Texas and suggestions of Collector. The record shall be written on the paper and form prescribed by the Comptroller of Public Accounts. The record shall be bound as directed by Collector. The expense for binding the two copies of the record to be delivered to Fort Bend County shall be paid by Fort Bend County in addition to the compensation paid to Contractor for compiling the record.

Contractor shall compare the credits shown on the copy of the delinquent tax records and delinquent lists of Fort Bend County on file in the office of the Comptroller of Public Accounts, Austin, Texas with the credits shown on the original copy of said records in the office of Collector. Contractor shall report all errors in credits to Collector. Contractor shall also report any errors in description, or other discrepancies discovered during the compilation of the record to Collector.

Collector agrees and binds himself and his successors in office to give expeditious attention to examination and approval of the record and to pay to Contractor upon completion, delivery and approval of the delinquent tax record supplement herein provided for and approval of the account for compiling the record the total sum for said record; to-wit: Ten Cents (\$.10) per item or written line, including lines of footings and recapitulation, shown on the original copy of the record. Said payment to be made in the manner and as is provided by Article 7336f, Vernon's Revised Civil Statutes of Texas.  7A- This Contract includes the year 1968 which taxes are not now delinquent. It is agreed and inderstood that the compilation will not be completed until after the 1968 taxes are reported

whereas, on the 31st day of July, 1969, the Commissioners Court of Fort Bend County, Texas, adopted a resolution authorizing the County Clerk of said County to give notice, as authorized by law, of the intention of said Commissioners Court to adopt an order on the 15th day of August, 1969, authorizing the issuance of time warrants of said county in the maximum amount of \$90,000, maturing serially with a maximum maturity date not later than February 15, 1980, bearing interest at a rate not exceeding 6% per annum, for the purpose of evidencing the indebtedness of said county for all or any part of the cost of purchasing and/or improving certain lands described in the aforesaid notice, including personal and professional services to be rendered and other incidental expenses to be incurred in connection therewith; and

WHEREAS, the State of Texas, hereinafter called the State, acting by and through the Texas Highway Department, proposed to make certain highway improvements on that section of the above indicated knighter Highway generally known as follows:

From the present road West of Rosenberg

To the existing facility near Stafford

whereas, the Houston Pipe Line Co. hereinafter called the Owner, proposes to retain, locate or relocate certain of its facilities and retain title to any property rights it may have on, along or across, and within or over such limits of the Enversers Highway right of way as indicated on the plans attached to Utility Agreement as executed by Owner on the 23 day of July \_\_\_\_\_\_, 19 69 , or on location sketches attached hereto except as provided below.

NOW, THEREFORE, it is hereby mutually agreed that joint usage for both highway and utility purposes will be made of the area within the Instead of Highway right of way limits as such area is defined and to the extent indicated on the aforementioned plans or sketches. Where Owner by reason of ownership of an easement or fee title or otherwise under law has the right to alter, modify or add to facilities presently located within the area above described or construct additional facilities therein, such right is hereby retained, provided, however, if existing facilities are to be altered or modified or new facilities constructed within said area the Owner agrees to notify the Texas Highway Department at least 45 days prior thereto, to furnish necessary sketches showing location, type of construction, and methods to be used for protection of traffic, and if, in the opinion of the Texas Highway Department, such alteration, modification, or new construction will injure the highway or endanger the traveling public using said \*\*Droserstate Highway, the Texas Highway Department shall have the right, within 30 days after the receipt of such notice, to prescribe such regulations as necessary for the protection of the Highway facility and the traveling public using said Anterstate Highway; provided further, however, that such regulations shall not extend to the requiring of the placement of intended overhead lines underground or the routing of any lines outside of the area of joint usage above described.

OWNER hereby agrees that access for servicing its facilities normally will be limited to access via (a) Frontage roads where provided (b) Nearby or adjacent public roads and streets, or (c) Trails along or near the highway right of way lines, connecting only to an intersecting road; from any one or all of which entry may be made to the outer portion of the highway right of way. Where supports, manholes, or other appurtenances of the Owner's facilities are located in medians or interchange areas, access to them from the through-traffic roadways or ramps will be permitted but only by permits issued by the State to the Owner setting forth the conditions for policing and other controls to protect highway users. If an emergency situation occurs, and the usual means of access for service operations as herein provided will not permit the immediate action required by the Owner in making emergency repairs as required for the safety and welfare of the public, the Owner shall have a temporary right of access to and from the through-traffic roadways and ramp as necessary to accomplish the required emergency repairs. Any future



THIS AGREEMENT, executed in duplicate, this day of 1969, by and between MISSOURI PACIFIC RATIROAD COMPANY, a Missouri Corporation, hereinafter called "Railroad", and the COUNTY OF FORT BEND, a political subdivision of the State of Texas, hereinafter called "Licensee", WITNESSETH:

#### RECITALS

0

Licensee has requested of Railroad permission to establish and maintain a public road crossing over certain lands of Railroad at Pecan Street, Mile Post 17-13, at Arcola, Ft. Bend County, Texas, to which Railroad is agreeable, but solely upon the terms and conditions hereinafter set forth.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the premises and of the premises and conditions hereinafter set forth, the parties hereto agree as follows:

- l. Railroad, solely to the extent of its right, title and interest, without any warranty, express or implied, hereby grants unto Licensee, its successors and assigns, license and permission to establish and construct, maintain and use a public highway, Pecan Street, and appurtenances (including drainage structures, paving and other necessary facilities) at grade, over upon and across Railroad's existing tracks and a certain specific parcel or tract of Railroad's right of way land situated in or near the City of Arcola, in Ft. Bend County, Texas, at Mile Post 17-13, approximately where shown in green color on Railroad's Gulf District white print dated April 4, 1969, prepared in Office of District Engineer, Houston, Texas, marked Exhibit A, attached hereto as part hereof.
- 2. It is expressly agreed, however, that this license and permission is granted, solely, for the purposes above set out and if the Licensee, its successors or assigns, shall cease to use the aforesaid premises, or any part thereof, for said purposes, this license and permission, as to the portion or portions so abandoned, shall expire and terminate at the time each portion, if any, shall be so abandoned; whereupon, Railroad, its successors and assigns, shall have the same complete title to the land as though these presents had never been executed and shall have the right to re-enter thereon and to exclude therefrom Licensee, its successors and assigns.
- 3. It is expressly understood and agreed by and between the parties hereto that this grant of right of way is made subject and subordinate to the rights of the Railroad, its successors, assigns, lessees and licensees, to maintain, operate and renew any telephone, telegraph, power and signal lines and poles, railroad tracks, roadways, pipe lines and any other facility of a similar or different character which is presently located on, under or over the hereinabove-described premises, or as relocated in accordance with any provisions which may be contained herein providing for such relocation.


It is further agreed between the parties hereto that the Railroad, its successors, assigns, lessees and licensees, may hereafter construct or install and thereafter maintain, operate and renew any or all of the above described facilities on the granted premises; provided, however, no such facilities shall be constructed or installed on the granted premises hereinabove described which will materially interfere with the Licensee's use thereof as herein provided. Licensee shall, when returning this agreement to Railroad signed, cause same to be accompanied by such order, resolution or ordinance of the governing body of Licensee, passed and approved as by law prescribed, and duly certified, evidencing the authority of the person executing this agreement on behalf of Licensee with the power so to do, and which shall also certify that funds have been appropriated and are available for the payment of any sums agreed to be paid by Licensee hereunder.





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#### RE: RESOLUTION CLEAR CREEK PROJECT

On Motion of Commissioner Louis Teykl, seconded by Commissioner Johnnie Philipp, and duly passed, the Court passed the following Resolution.

#### RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, a federal project for the improvement of Clear Creek has been authorized by the Flood Control Act of 1968 (82 Stat. 737, P.L. 90-483), and WHEREAS, said project is conditioned upon the assumption by local interests of certain responsibilities as hereinafter set out, and

WHEREAS, Fort Bend County, a political subdivision of the State of Texas, desires to sponsor said project by furnishing such required local cooperation within its territorial and jurisdictional limits, and is legally authorized to furnish same and financially capable of so doing.

Now therefore, in consideration of the premises and the benefits which will accrue to the citizens of Fort Bend County from the construction of said project, be it resolved by the Commissioners Court of Fort Bend County that, in connection with the federal project for improvement of Clear Creek, said Fort Bend County hereby agrees that prior to the initiation of project construction it will, within its territorial and jurisdictional limits:

- a. Provide without cost to the United States all lands, easements, rights-of-way, and spoil disposal areas necessary for construction of the project;
- b. Provide without cost to the United States all relocations and alterations of buildings, utilities, bridges (except railroad bridges) and roads, severs, pipelines, and other alterations of existing improvements which may be required for construction of the project;
- a. Hold and save the United States free from damages due to the construction works;
- d. Maintain all works after completion in accordance with regulations prescribed by the Secretary of the Army;
- e. Prevent any encreachment on the flood-carrying capacities of the improved channel;
- f. Assume responsibility for coordination of all appropriate local agencies to the end that adequate lateral channels and drains shall be provided and maintained without cost to the United States;

- g. At least annually, notify all interested parties that the project will provide protection from upstream flooding up to the 100-year flood but will not provide protection from hurricane or storm tide flooding; and
- h. Provide guidance and leadership in preventing unwise and uneconomical future development of the flood plain areas by encouraging prudent
  use of flood proofing, land regulation planning, or other flood plain management techniques to reduce flood losses.

First Party agrees to employ and does hereby employ Second Party to enforce by suit or otherwise, and to aid and assist the local officers in the enforcement of the collection of all delinquent State and county ad valorem taxes, penalty and interest, and all delinquent taxes, penalty and interest (except taxes of independent school districts and incorporated cities and towns) due any and all political subdivisions or defined districts of said county and State which the County Tax Collector receives and receipts for, under the provisions of Article 7254, Revised Statutes, 1925, and shown to be delinquent upon the delinquent tax records of said county from 1939 to the date of the termination of this contract as fixed in Section IX hereof (including such personal property or insolvent taxes as the Commissioners Court and Second Party mutually deem collectible.)

Taxes which become delinquent during the term of this contract shall become subject to the terms of this contract on September 1st of the year in which the same shall become delinquent. And further, with reference to taxes not now delinquent, but which become delinquent during the term hereof, or taxes which may have fallen delinquent on February 1st or subsequent thereto next preceding the date of this contract, it is agreed that where suit is or has been brought on any property for prior years delinquent taxes, Second Party shall include in his action all taxes on the property involved, delinquent before trial, whether before or after September 1st of such year; and where the State and County or impleaded or intervene in a suit brought by another taxing unit, it shall be Second Party's duty to include in his answer or intervention all taxes

delinquent before trial on the property involved, whether such taxes fall delinquent before or after September 1st of such year; and in all such cases Second Party shall be entitled to the commission herein provided for collecting delinquent taxes.

Second Party is to call to the attention of the County Tax Collector or other officials any errors, double assessments, or other discrepancies coming under his observation during the progress of the work, and all charges on the tax rolls that show from 1939 to the date of the termination of this contract to be delinquent, which are caused through error, conflicts, double renditions, illegal assessments, etc. A cancellation certificate shall be prepared on forms furnished by the State Comptroller of Public Accounts, Austin, Texas, showing how such errors came about, and which shall be sufficiently full and complete as to justify the Commissioners Court in ordering a cancellation certificate issued, and that will meet with the approval of the Comptroller of Public Accounts, Austin, Texas.

IV.

Second Party hereby agrees and obligates himself to communicate with each and every person, firm, association or corporation owing any of such taxes, with a view of collecting same; and shall, before filing suits for the recovery of delinquent taxes for any year or years prepare, in triplicate, delinquent tax notices, and shall mail one of such notices to the owner or owners of said property at their last known address, covering all delinquent taxes shown to be due on the tax rolls of said county, as provided for in Article 7324, Revised Civil Statutes, 1925, as amended by Chapter 117, page 196, Acts of the 42nd Legislature, Regular Session, and file one copy of such notice with the Tax Assessor-Collector. In the event that the taxes, together with penalty and interest, are not paid within thirty (30) days from the date such statements and notices are mailed, then Second Party shall prepare, file and institute, as soon as practical thereafter, a suit for the collection of said taxes, penalty and interest, which suit shall include all past due taxes for all previous years on such tract or tracts; and where there are several lots in the same addition or subdivision delinquent, belonging to the same owner or owners, all said delinquent lots shall be made the subject of a single suit, and which suit shall be prosecuted with dispatch to final judgment and sale unless said taxes are sooner collected.

Second Party, where it is necessary to prepare and file suits for the enforced collection of delinquent taxes on real property, shall make and furnish an abstract of the property which shall show the amount of delinquent taxes due against each and every tract, lot or parcel of land, and shall show the number of acres so delinquent and a correct description of the property, the year delinquent, how it was charged upon the tax rolls, the correct name of owner or owners of the property at the time it became delinquent, the person from whom and the date that he or they derived title to said property, the Volume and page of public records that his or their deed or other title evidence is of record, and the date that each subsequent change of ownership occured down to the present ownership. It shall further show the name of any and all outstanding lien holders and lease-hold interests of record, and all other information necessary for the proper preparation and filing of suit or suits for the collection of delinquent taxes. Second Party shall perform these services at his own cost and expense. And in case such abstract is not placed with the papers in a court proceeding, it shall be filed with the Tax Collector for the purpose of maintaining its preservation until such time as all of the taxes to which it pertains, or such part thereof as are held to be due, are paid.

#### VL.

Second Party shall prepare, or aid and assist the County or District Attorney in preparing, all petitions, citations, notices by publication, personal service citations, notices by posting, judgments, notices of sale, orders of sale and any and all other things necessary or required to be done for the collection of all delinquent taxes, and shall render all necessary and proper assistance to each of the other officers to the end that all taxes assessed or unknown and unrendered now delinquent, or that may become delinquent during the life of this contract and be so reported on Comptroller's forms provided therefor, may be collected; and when collections are not made, to assist in reducing same to final judgment and sale.

#### V11.

It is further agreed and understood that Second Party shall furnish, at his own expense, all stationery, legal blanks or forms, stamps, envelopes and

printing, together with all labor necessary to complete said contract including labor and expense incurred in procuring date and information as to the name, identity and location of necessary parties, and in procuring necessary legal descriptions of the property as provided in Paragraph V, and the expenses incurred in citing the defendants by publication in all cases where such expenses are not collected as costs against the defendant or defendants in the tax suit, but in no event shall such cost be paid to Second Party; and Second Party shall pay off and discharge any and all bills for any other expenses incurred in the prosecution of said work, and it is hereby understood and agreed that said First Party shall not be responsible for the payment of such expense or any part thereof.

#### VIII.

First Party agrees to pay to Second Party as compensation for the services hereunder required 15 per cent (Not to exceed fifteen (15) per cent) of the amount collected of all delinquent taxes, penalty and interest of the years covered hereby, actually collected and paid to the Collector of Taxes during the term of his contract, which Second Party is instrumental in collecting as evidenced by copies of communication, tax notices or abstracts filed with the Tax Collector prior to the payment of such tax, including collection of taxes on property not appearing on the assessment rolls nor shown delinquent, but which would have been so shown had it been properly assessed, discovered by said Second Party, as and when collected, following the end of each month within the period of this contract, accordingly as the Collector makes up his monthly reports. The per cent of compensation here referred to shall be contingent upon the collection of such taxes as by Act of the Legislature are required to be collected. Should any remission of penalty and interest on taxes appearing on the delinquent records be made by legislative enactment effective during the period of this contract, the same shall not be collected nor commission allowed thereon. Also, ad valorem taxes, delinquent, levied against State-owned property for county and district purposes, the payment of which is to be taken care of by legislative appropriation provided for by Statute, are excluded from the provisions of this contract. Second Party shall not receive or collect any taxes, penalty or interest under this contract, but the same shall be paid to the Tax Assessor-Collector as other delinquent taxes.

This contract shall be in force from January 1. 19\_70, 19 70, both dates inclusive, (not to extend to <u>December 31.</u> beyond December 31, 19\_\_\_\_, the end of the present administration of the Commissioner's Court), and at the expiration of said period this contract shall terminate, except the contractor shall be allowed six (6) months in which to prosecute to trial court judgment suits filed prior to December 31, 1970 , terminating date of this contract provided, and shall handle to conclusion all suits in which trial court judgments are obtained during the period of this contract and which are appealed by any party. The Commissioners Court and the State Comptroller shall have the right to sooner terminate this contract for cause, giving thirty (30) days written notice of such intention, with a statement of the cause or reasons for such termination, after giving Second Party a reasonable opportunity of explaining or rectifying the same. In case of such termination, Second Party shall be entitled to receive and retain all compensation due up to the date of said termination.

x.

Before any commissions are paid out under the terms of this contract, Second Party shall furnish a good and sufficient bond, payable to the County Judge and to his successors in office, in the sum of Five Thousand Dollars, (not to be less then \$1,000.00 accordingly as the Commissioners Court deems just and proper) to be executed by a solvent surety company; or if executed by private parties, the bond shall be signed by at least three good and sufficient sureties owning unincumbered real estate subject to execution, of value equal to the amount of bond and conditioned upon the specific performance of the terms hereof, including the making of reports, provided for in Section X1 of this contract, and further conditioned that he shall forthwith pay over to the Tax-Collector, or other persons justly entitled thereto, any money or commissions paid him by mistake, through error, or otherwise. Said bond shall be approved in open Commissioners Court, signed by the Couty Judge, filed and recorded in the County Clerk's office, and a certified copy of same furnished to the State Comptroller.

At the end of each month, or as soon thereafter as the Tax Assessor-Collector shall have made up his report showing collections made for such month, said Second Party shall have access to said report and shall by comparison of the same with his own files or records of service, copies of which he has filed with the Tax Assessor-Collector, make up in triplicate a report of collections out of which he is entitled to commission under the terms of this contract. Second Party shall also have access to the Collector's receipts for such collections and shall, in his reports to be made on forms furnished by the Comptroller, show each year and the taxes collected therefor on a separate line. Also, where collections are made after suit has been filed and commission allowed at a greater or different rate under the terms of this contract Second Party, being guided by the file docket of the Clerk of the Court, shall prepare and attach to his reports to be filed with the Tax Assessor-Collector a list showing number of suit and date filed; but in no event shall Second Party receive compensation in excess of fifteen (15) per cent as herein provided. After the report has been signed and sworn to by Second Party, two copies of the same shall be delivered to the Tax Assessor-Collector, one to be attached to and sent with the Collector's monthy report to the Comptroller, the other to be filed in the Collector's office, and the third copy to be retained by Second Party.

#### X11.

Each month, after having received copies of the contractor's report as provided for in the preceding Section, and after having checked the list of taxes shown therein with his own report and with copies of communications filed with him, as provided for in Section XIII of this contract, and after having verified the correctness of commissions claimed, the County Tax Assessor-Collector is hereby authorized, ordered and directed to deduct the above specified per cent of said taxes, penalty and interest, or such amount as can be allowed under the penalty and interest restriction, to which Second Party is entitled, and to pay the same to him unless otherwise herein directed, and to take his receipt as provided for on Form 107, Contractor's Report, which when received in the Comptroller's office will be the Comptroller's authority to allow the said Tax Assessor-Collector credit for the amount so paid. The Tax Assessor-Collector,

before complying with the provisions of this Section, shall first satisfy himself that the bond required of Second Party under the provisions of Section 10 of this contract has been approved and placed on record in the office of the County Clerk; and it is hereby further provided, that should any question arise regarding commission claimed, the Tax Assessor-Collector shall withhold the payment of such commission or an amount equal thereto, placing the same in escrow, and apply to the State and county, accordingly as they may be affected, for information and direction as to the proper amount of commission due to be allowed under the terms of this contract.

NOTE:

Should the Commissioners Court and the contracting party elect that the commissions withheld be placed in an escrow fund and paid to the Second Party otherwise than as provided in Section XII of this contract, another Section setting forth the method of payment to the contracting party should be added to and inserted in this contract preceding the last page prepared for the signatures of the contracting parties.

#### X111.

In order that the Tax Assessor-Collector may be able to verify and attest the correctness of commissions claimed by Second Party, as evidence of service and to entitle him to the commissions provided for in this contract, Second Party shall file with the Tax Assessor-Collector prior to time of payment, copies of such communications, tax notices or abstracts which shall be preserved by the Tax Assessor-Collector in some systematical order as will make them easily accessible for the purpose of verification or for such other value as the same may have in case it becomes necessary for the county and State to buy in such properties at tax sales. Said copy or copies shall also contain such information or reference as will enable the Tax Assessor-Collector to readily locate the tax as it appears on his delinquent forms and delinquent records.

#### XIV.

It is further agreed and understood that this contract is for personal services and is not transferable or assignable without the written consent and approval of First Party. It is also agreed that the Commissioners Court of said county shall furnish suitable space in or near the courthouse, as convenient to the records of said county as may be, for the purpose of carrying out the obligations of this contract by Second Party, all of which shall be performed by him in \_\_Fort\_Bend \_\_\_\_\_ County, Texas.

It shall be the duty of the Commissioners Court and of all other officials of said county to cooperate with and render such reasonable assistance to said Second Party as the circumstances may require. Said assistance, however, is not to include the actual performance of the work herein designated to be performed by Second Party; and it being the duty of the County Attorney or of the District Attorney (where there is no County Attorney) to actively assist Second Party in the filing and pushing to a speedy conclusion all suits for the collection of delinquent taxes, it is hereby provided that where the County Attorney or District Attorney (where there is no County Attorney) shall fail or refuse to file and prosecute such suits in good faith, the Attorney prosecuting suits under this contract is here fully empowered and authorized to proceed with such suits without the joinder and assistance of said Courty or District Attorney. Second Party shall not become the purchaser of any property at tax sales under this contract, but may bid in the property for the State or county at such sales.

On this Midday of December, A. D., 1969, came on to be heard and considered the above entitled and numbered cause, and came the Plaintiffs, Donald D. Napier, Jr., L. D. Erwin, Mrs. Walter Lalley and Evelyn B. Boldt, and by their counsel herein, and came the Defendants, County of Fort Bend, Texas, and Josh Gates, in his capacity as County Judge of Fort Bend County, and John Pustka, Louis Teykl, John M. Davis and Johnnie Philipp, in their capacities as commissioners of the Commissioners Court of Fort Bend County, Texas, and by their counsel herein, and all parties announced ready for trial, waived trial by jury, and all matters of fact as well as of law, were submitted to the Court for adjudication; and it appearing to the Court:

- (1) That the parties have stipulated and agreed, and this court is satisfied, that this case is not one that is required to be heard and determined by a District Court of Three Judges, but is one that can and should be determined by the single Judge in whose court this case was originally filed; and,
- (2) That the Plaintiffs brought this suit in behalf of themselves and eligible voters in Fort Bend County, Texas, as a class suit in behalf of themselves and the other residents, taxpayers and voters of Fort BendCounty, Texas; and,
- (3) That the Defendant, Commissioners Court of Fort Bend County, Texas, is a unit of local government created under the Constitution and laws of the State of Texas, with responsibility for the affairs of Fort Bend County, Texas; and,

- (4) That to the satisfaction of this Court there is a considerable population disparity between the four (4) Commissioner precincts of Fort Bend County, Texas, as the same were defined prior to the institution of this suit, and that the law requires an immediate redistricting of such Commissioner precincts in order to accomplish a reasonably equal population of each Commissioner precinct; and,
- (5) That in accordance with the direction of this court, the parties have agreed on, and the Commissioners Court of Fort Bend County, Texas, has adopted and presented to this Court a plan of redistricting Fort Bend County, Texas, into the four (4) Commissioner precincts, which are described and set forth in the following exhibits, which are incorporated herein and made a part hereof, to-wit:
  - EXHIBIT 1, hereto attached, contains field notes, of Commissioner's Precinct No. ONe, Fort Bend County, Texas.
  - 2. EXHIBIT 2, hereto attached, contains field notes of Commissioner's Precinct No. Two, Fort Bend County, Texas.
  - 3. EXHIBIT 3, hereto attached, contains field notes of Commissioner's Precinct No. Three, Fort Bend County, Texas.
  - 4. EXHIBIT 4, hereto attached, contains field notes of Commissioner's Precinct No. Four, Fort Bend County, Texas.
- (6) That in connection with any redistricting plan, it is necessary that the election precincts in Fort Bend County, be redefined and located so that no election precinct, in said county, shall cross a Commissioner's precinct line, and so that any election precinct, as redefined and located, shall lie wholly within one Commissioner's precinct.

It is therefore ORDERED, ADJUDGED AND DECREED by this Court:

(1) That this case is not one that is required

to be heard and determined by a District Court of Three Judges, but is one that can and should be determined by the single Judge in whose court this case was originally filed; and,

- (2) That the Plaintiffs brought this suit in behalf of themselves and eligible voters in Fort Bend County, Texas, as a class suit in behalf of themselves and the other residents, taxpayers and voters of Fort Bend County, Texas; and,
- (3) That the Defendant, Commissioners Court of Fort Bend County, Texas, is a unit of local government created under the Constitution and laws of the State of Texas, with responsibility for the affairs of Fort Bend County, Texas; and,
- (4) That the law requires an immediate redistricting of such Commissioner precincts in order to accomplish a reasonably equal population of each Commissioner's precinct; and,
- (4) Commissioner's precincts of Fort Bend County, Texas, as adopted by the Commissioners Court under the direction of this Court, is hereby approved; and Fort Bend County, Texas, is hereby redistricted into the four (4) County Commissioner precincts, which are defined and set forth in four (4) exhibits hereto attached:
  - 1. EXHIBIT ONE, defining and locating the boundaries of Commissioner Precinct No. One of Fort Bend County, Texas.
  - 2. EXHIBIT TWO, defining and locating the boundaries of Commissioner Precinct No. Two of Fort Bend County, Texas.
  - 3. EXHIBIT THREE, defining and locating the boundaries of Commissioner Precinct No. Three of Fort Bend County, Texas.
  - 4. EXHIBIT FOUR, defining and locating the boundaries of Commissioner Precinct No. Four of Fort Bend County, Texas.

and that such exhibits are made a part hereof, by reference; and that from this day forward said County shall be, and is hereby recognized, as being redistricted into the four (4) Commissioner precincts as herein described and defined.

(6) That in connection herewith, said Commissioners Court is hereby ORDERED and DIRECTED to immediately redefine and locate any election precincts, bordering on said newly defined and located Commissioners Court precincts, so that any election precinct shall be relocated and defined as lying wholly within one of the Commissioners Court precincts; and that any voter registration list shall be corrected and revised to list the name of voters in the newly defined and located election precinct as hereby directed.

It is further ORDERED THAT ALL RELIEF NOT HEREIN granted, is hereby denied.

It is further ORDERED AND ADJUDGED that any balance of Court costs herein are adjudged against the Plaintiffs, for which let execution issue.

### RE: CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS FORT BEND COUNTY CHILD WELFARE BOARD, APPROVED

On Motion of Commissioner Johnnie Pustka, seconded by Commissioner Johnnie Philipp, and duly passed, the Court approved the Constitution and By-Laws Fort Bend County Child Welfare Board, as follows:

### CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS FORT BEND COUNTY CHILD WELFARE BOARD

#### Article I - Introduction

- 1. Name: The name of this organization shall be the "Fort Bend County Child Welfare Board."
- 2. Authority: This organization was formed in October, November, December, 1969, by appointment of members to said Board by Commissioners Court of Fort Bend County, Texas, in accordance with laws of State of Texas.

#### Article II - B oard of Directors

- 1. Number: The Fort Bend County Child Welfare Board shall consist of twelve resident persons to be appointed by Commissioners Court of Fort Bend County, Texas.
- 2. Members: The Board membership shall include both men and women and the Board membership shall include persons from various communities within the county.
- 3. Term of office: The Board of Directors terms shall begin January 1st and end December 31st, and they shall serve a term of three years or until their successors are appointed; however, during the first year beginning January 1, 1970, every director shall draw lots to determine his or her term of office, with one-third (1/3) of Directors serving for one (1) year, one-third (1/3) of Directors serving for two (2) years, and one-third (1/3) of Directors serving for three (3) years.
- 4. Term limitation: After serving two (2) consecutive terms as a member of the Board of Directors, a member of the Board shall not be eligible for reappointment, except that persons having so served may be reappointed only after an interim of one year following such previous service.
- 5. Interim vacancies: Any interim vacancies are to be filled by the Commissioners Court as they occur and the new appointee is to fill the unexpired term of the vacating member or members.

- 6. Appointment of Members: One-third (1/3) of the Board of Directors shall be appointed by Commissioners Court of Fort Bend County at their first meeting in December of each year.
- 7. Absences from Board Meetings: Three (3) consecutive unexcused absences from the regular meetings of the Board of Directors shall be considered an automatic resignation from membership of the Board. The Board of Directors shall make the final decisions relating to unexcused absences. Vacancies so created shall be filled as herein above provided.
- Advisory Members: The Board of Directors may have an Advisory Committee consisting of representatives of all public and private agencies existing in the County who wish to serve, and this advisory committee should include state and county officials. The persons on the advisory committee shall have no voting privileges and shall hold no office. Advisory committee members may be asked to serve in any capacity where needed and would serve as permanent members in this respect, so long as Board desires them to

#### Article III - Meetings

1. It is hereby provided that meetings shall be held at least once a month in some suitable place and at such time as may be designated by the Board. Special meetings may be called at any time and place by the Chairman or by six members. Three days notice shall be given by mail or telephone for regular or special meetings.

#### Article IV - Officers

1. It is hereby provided that the Board shall elect as officers in January of each year at its regular meeting a chairman, vice-chairman, treasurer and secretary to serve for ensuing year.

#### 2. Duties of Officers:

- (a) Chairman: Shall be presiding officer of the Board. He shall perform all duties pertaining to his office and those additional duties delegated by the Board.
- (b) Vice-Chairman: The vice-chairman shall in case of absence or disability of the chairman perform the duties of the chairman.
- (c) Treasurer: The treasurer shall receive and disburse any funds made available to the Board for the use of the unit other than County allotted funds for child care. All moneys spent by the Board shall be paid by check signed by the treasurer and counter signed by the Child Welfare Supervisor. In addition, the treasurer shall perform other duties delegated to him by the Board.

(d) Secretary: The secretary shall be the recording officer of the Board. He shall conduct the correspondence and perform all duties pertaining to his office and additional duties delegated to him by the Board.

#### Article V - Committees

1. There shall be appointed by the chairman the following standing committees:

(1) Finance Committee, to secure funds; (2) Education and publicity Committee; (3) Case Committee; whose functions shall be to aid the supervisor in formulating intake and discharge policies and to discuss case problems; (4) Service Committee, may be appointed for enlisting the aid of volunteers for securing medical service, clothing and other services. Other committees may be appointed as the need arises. The chairman of each committee shall be a member of the Child Welfare Board. Committees shall serve until their successors are appointed.

#### Article VI - Purposes

- 1. Responsibilities of the Fort Bend County Child Welfare Board shall include:
  - (1) Developing local resources for child care.
  - (2) Interpreting to the community the program as it develops.
  - (3) Maintaining high standards of case work.
  - (4) Safeguarding the confidential status of all social records.
  - (5) Making uniform reports to the Division of Child Welfare.
  - (6) Making monthly reports to the Commissioners Court.
  - (7) Cooperate with all other agencies—local, statewide and national—in coordinating the community program for the welfare of children.
  - (8) Cooperate with the Division of Child Welfare in matters of studies, surveys, and reports that there may be a comprehensive picture of Child Welfare in Texas.

#### Article VII - General

- 1. A majority of the membership shall constitute a quorum for business at any meeting and Robert's "Rules of Order Revised" shall govern parliamentary procedures of the Board.
- 2. The County Auditor of Fort Bend County or an auditor selected by the Board shall audit the Child Welfare books annually or as often as determined by the Commissioners Court. A copy of the audit shall be supplied to the Child Welfare Board.
- 3. The fiscal year of the Fort Bend County Child Welfare Unit shall begin January 1 and end December 31.

### Article VIII - Amendments

1. Amendments: The Constitution and By-Laws may be amended at any regular meeting of the Board of Directors by a majority vote of the members present and voting, provided that the proposed amendment has been submitted in writing to each member of the Board at least ten days in advance of each meeting.

WHEREAS, the State of Texas, acting by and through the Texas Highway Department, hereinafter called the State, and the County have previous to this date entered into a contract agreeing that the State will reimburse the County 50% of the eligible cost of the adjustment, removal or relocation of certain utility facilities necessitated as a result of highway improvements on the subject project;

WHEREAS, the Owner, in an affidavit dated Scot, 26, 19 68 has asserted an interest in certain lands and that this proposed highway improvement will necessitate the adjustment, removal or relocation of certain facilities of the Owner now located upon such lands as indicated in the following statement of work:

Install 3 H-Frame Tangent Structures and Remove 2 H-Frame Tangent Structures.

WHEREAS, the County desires to accomplish the adjustment, removal or relocation of the Owner's utility facilities by entering into an agreement with the Owner;

NOW, THEREFORE, be it mutually agreed that this contract entered into this date between the parties hereto is intended to implement and effectuate the terms and provisions of that contract of February 12 , 19 68 , entered into between the State and the County, as it pertains to right of way utility adjustments and as it affects the utility facilities of the Owner.

Upon execution of this agreement by the parties hereto, and upon approval by the State of the Plans, Estimate of Costs, Affidavit of Property Ownership, and other instruments attached hereto, the County will, by written notice, to which shall be attached (1) a copy of the State's letter approving said attachments hereto and (2) a copy of the Commissioner's Court Order authorizing execution of this agreement, authorize the Owner to proceed with the necessary adjustment, removal or relocation; and the Owner agrees to prosecute such work diligently to completion in such manner as will not result in avoidable interference or delay in either the State's Highway construction or in said work.

The Owner will carry out said adjustments, removals or relocations in accordance with the plans attached hereto, and the costs paid by the County pursuant to this contract shall be full compensation to the Owner for the costs incurred in making said adjustments, removals, or relocations. Final bills for work hereunder shall be submitted to the County not later than ninety (90) days after completion of the work.

The County agrees to pay the Owner and the Owner agrees to accept the total actual, and related indirect, costs, provided, however, that the County shall in no event be liable under this agreement for more than \$ \_\_\_\_ 3,600 (hereinafter called the "ceiling cost"), as full reimbursement for work covered by this contract, said reimbursement in full to be forthcoming only after receipt of final billing and a certificate of the Texas Highway Department to the effect that such work has been fully accomplished. The County further agrees that if the final billing is accompanied by a letter from the District 12 or Houston Urban Project office (as appropriate) of the Texas Highway Department stating that the final billing has been examined by said office and is tentatively approved, subject to final approval by the Austin Office of the Texas Highway Department, then the County will, within 60 days of receipt of said final billing and letter, make payment to the Owner in the amount of 90% of the cost tentatively approved; provided, however, that said payment shall not exceed 90% of the ceiling cost. Owner's interests in the land within the right of way is to be made subject to a joint use agreement to be executed in the form of Exhibit 1.

Any future construction, reconstruction, expansion or other work which would serve to raise the elevation of any roadway constructed within the limits of the property covered by this Permit in excess of one (1.0) foot above that shown, or other wise require the adjustment of Owner's facilities, shall be deemed to be outside the scope of this Permit and will require a new written permit. However, in the event of an emergency, it being evident that immediate action is necessary for protection of the public and to minimize property damage and loss of investment, either party hereto may at their own responsibility and risk make necessary emergency repairs, notifying the other party heretc of this action as soon as is practical.

OWNER hereby agrees that pedestrian and vehicular access for servicing its facilities normally will be limited to (a) Frontage roads where provided (b) Nearby or adjacent public roads and streets (c) Trails along or near the highway right of way lines, connected only to an intersecting road, from any one or all of which entry may be made to the outer portion of the right of way. If an emergency situation occurs and the usual means of access for service operations as herein provided will not permit the immediate action required by the Owner in making emergency repairs as required for the safety and welfare of the public, the Owner shall take access to and from the through traffic roadways and ramps as necessary to accomplish the required emergency repairs. Owner agrees that to the extent possible, the required emergency repairs will be accomplished giving due consideration to the paramount interest of the traveling public to the use of the highway facility.



#### RECITALS:

State desires to use a certain portion of Santa Fe's property near Crabb, Fort Bend County, Texas, upon which to construct and thereafter maintain and use a Public Road, which is agreeable to Santa Fe upon the terms and conditions hereinafter stated.

### AGREEMENT ARTICLE I

Santa Fe, for and in consideration of the sum of One and No/100 Dollars (\$1.00) cash to it paid by State, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, and of the full and faithful performance by State of its covenants hereinafter set forth, hereby licenses State to use a portion of Santa Fe's property situated near Crabb, Fort Bend County, Texas, for the purpose of constructing, maintaining and using a Public Road, the property, license to use which is hereby given, being shown in red on print

D.E.O. Temple, Texas, No. 7163, dated August 4, 1969, hereto attached, marked "Exhibit A", and made a part hereof.

### ARTICLE II

In consideration of the aforesaid license, State covenants and agrees to and with Santa Fe as follows:

- 1. That it will use the licensed premises exclusively as a site for a Public Road.
- 2. That it will not let or sublet the whole or any part of the licensed premises for any purpose whatsoever or assign this license without the written consent of Santa Fe in each instance.
- 3. That in case of eviction of State by anyone owning or claiming title to the whole or any part of the licensed premises, Santa Fe shall not be liable to State for any damage of any nature whatsoever.
- 4. That if the licensed premises, or any part thereof, cease to be used at any time for the purpose licensed, State will deliver up to Santa Fe the possession of the whole, or such part so ceased to be used.
- 5. That it will use the licensed premises and maintain the Public Road to be located thereon in such manner as not to interfere with, hinder, or in any manner obstruct the use by

Santa Fe of the railroad or other property adjacent thereto. In the event of a breach of this covenant at any time, State will, within ten (10) days after receipt of written notice from Santa Fe thereof, do whatever may be necessary to remedy such condition, at State's expense.

- 6. That no legal right of Santa Fe to maintain, use and relocate the railroad track or tracks, or other railroad facilities now located upon the licensed premises, or to construct and thereafter maintain, use and relocate any additional track or tracks, or other railroad facilities as it may desire, upon or across said licensed premises shall be in anywise affected by the giving of this license.
- 7. That it will bear and pay the entire cost of constructing and maintaining the Public Road upon the licensed premises, including any and all drainage facilities made necessary or required because thereof, except that Santa Fe shall maintain the crossing between the ends of ties at its own expense.
- 8. That this license is made subject to all valid, existing and future contracts, agreements, licenses and easements which may affect said property, covering roads, public or private; pole lines and appurtenances; pipe lines, or other facilities.
  - 9. That all of the covenants hereof shall inure to

the benefit of the successors and assigns of Santa Fe, to the same extent as to Santa Fe.

## ARTICLE III

County joins in the execution hereof to evidence its agreement to assume the cost of relocation of power and/or communication poles and wires as shown on the attached estimate of \$1,800 by Santa Fe's Chief Engineer.

Any reasonable changes or alterations may be made by Santa Fe if it so elects, but any changes shall be approved by the Commissioner's Court, and if approved, bill for the cost will be paid by the County.

## ARTICLE IV

The parties mutually covenent and agree as follows:

That this license shall be effective from its date, and thereafter so long as said Public Road shall be located on the licensed premises and be maintained in accordance with the provisions of Section 5 of Article II hereof.

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

AGREEMENT FOR PARTICIPATION IN A CHILD WELFARE PROGRAM BYFORT BEND COUNTY AND THE TEXAS STATE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WELFARE

whereas, the Texas State Department of Public Welfare, hereinafter referred to as the Department, and <u>Fort Bound</u> County, hereinafter referred to as the County, for the purpose of establishing and maintaining a Child Welfare Program in such County to be participated in by the Department and the County, entered into on June 1-1965 and Agreement which, together with any amendments or modifications, is currently in effect;

WHEREAS, Title IV of the Federal Social Security Act was amended by Public Law 90-248 so as to expand the Foster Care Program and to make available Federal funds which would enable the State to extend its Foster Care Program;

WHEREAS, the Department has submitted and obtained approval by the Department of Health, Education, and Welfare of its State Plan for AFDC Foster Care indicating that the effective date of this approval is July 1, 1969, and that Federal financial participation is available starting July 1, 1969, with the understanding that said Plan would currently apply on a Statewide basis;

WHEREAS, the purposes of the AFDC Foster Care Program are to provide foster care for AFDC children, to provide an opportunity for rehabilitation of the child's home with the view of returning the child to its own home, and for the eventual implementation of the AFDC Foster Care Program on a Statewide basis;

WHEREAS, under the original Agreement the County agreed to provide adequate funds, through its regular budgeting process, for all necessary child care and treatment and for the expansion of the full range of Child Welfare services, including foster home protective services; and

WHEREAS, the parties to said Agreement mutually agree that for the purpose of clarification and amplification of their Agreement so as to include foster care for dependent children under the AFDC Foster Care Program, a written Amendment to said Agreement is necessary;

THEREFORE, the Department and the County mutually agree to amend their Original Agreement, the terms and provisions of which, not in conflict with the following, are to continue in full force and effect except as specifically amended hereafter:

Under the 1967 Amendments to the Federal Social Security Act, the Child Welfare Services Program and the Aid to Families with Dependent Children Program were placed under a single organizational unit, thus making it possible for the staff of the Department to provide services for all children that were previously identified under one of these programs. This was further solidified in the Federal law by moving the Child Welfare Services Program from Title V of the Social Security Act to Title IV, where it is now identified as Part B while AFDC services are identified in Part A of the same Title.

The Department, wishing to offer maximum support to the County program of foster care for children, is desirous of implementing a plan which resulted from this legislation. This would enable the Department to forward to the County Child Welfare Board the claimable Federal financial participation for foster care now being paid by the County through its appropriation to the Child Welfare Board for children whose eligibility can be established under the AFDC program.

The County agrees that its present Foster Care Program will be modified so as to meet the requirements for AFDC foster care. The County agrees to pay as authorized by the County Child Welfare Board the full cost of board and care for any child covered by this Program, and the Department will forward to the County Child Welfare Board the Federal share out of the Federal funds allocated to the Department for that purpose, said transaction to be made in accordance with Section 403, Title IV of the Federal Social Security Act (as of this date, the average maximum payment for foster care for such children in the County shall not exceed \$100.00 of all funds). This action will be taken by the Department upon receiving a verified and proper bill from the County Child Welfare Board, and will be made in accordance with rules and regulations of the Department's State Plan as approved by the Department of Health, Education, and Welfare, and agreements mutually worked out between the Department and the Board.

In accordance with Section 1117, Title XI of the Federal Social Security Act, the County agrees that it shall not reduce its total net expenditures below the sum of the County appropriations for Child Welfare Services for the preceding fiscal year and the amount forwarded to the County as indicated in the preceding paragraph from the Department for foster care for the current fiscal year. The County will extend such program in such manner as will best carry out the purposes of the Agreement and of maintaining effort for strengthening the program and affording care and services on behalf of the needy children in the County.

On or after July 1, 1969, all children under twenty-one (21) years of age for whom the Texas State Department of Public Welfare assumes financial responsibility, in whole or in part, and who are being cared for in the Foster Care Program shall be eligible to receive medical care under the Title XIX Medical Assistance Program administered by the Department. The County shall assume the responsibility of paying the State's part of the premium for Title XIX coverage and the coverage for AFDC Foster Care children will be effective July 1, 1969, and for all other Foster Care children effective September 1, 1969.

The Department shall on a month to month basis forward to the County Child Welfare Board any funds due and payable under the terms of this Contract less funds due to the Department under the terms of the Contract. The method of making such payment shall be governed by the fiscal procedures of the Department.

I.

The name of the proposed District shall be "FORT BEND COUNTY FRESH WATER SUPPLY DISTRICT NO.1".

II.

Said District shall contain an area of approximately 210.96 acres of land situated wholly within Fort Bend County, Texas, and described by metes and bounds as follows:

Lying wholly in Fort Bend County and being 210.96 Acres, more or less, out of the Henry Scott League, Abstract No. 83, and described as follows:

For connection, begin at the Southwest corner of the Henry Scott League, Abstract No. 83, Fort Bend County, Texas;

THENCE South 89 degrees 30 minutes East, along the South line of the Henry Scott League, 4,765 feet to a point in the center line of Klauke Road, same being the Southwest corner of Rosenberg Farms Subdivision as recorded in Volume 3, Page 575 of the Deed Records of Fort Bend County, Texas, and also being the Southeast corner of the Herbert Blase 87 Acre Tract;

THENCE North, along the West line of said Rosenberg Farms Subdivision and the East line of the Herbert Blase Tract, 2,208.33 feet to the Southwest corner of Lot 41, Rosenberg Farms, for the Point and Place of Beginning of the herein described District Boundary;

THENCE continuing North, along the West line Lots 41, 40, Glendale Addition of Lots 35 (Volume 341, Page 594, Deed Records), Highway Acres Subdivision of Lot 34 (Volume 237, Page 440, Deed Records), being the West line of Rosenberg Farms Subdivision, and the East line of the Herbert Blase Tract, a distance of 3,073.94 feet to the intersection of the said West line of Rosenberg Farms Subdivision with the Southeast line of the 100 foot wide right-of-way of U. THENCE, North 56 degrees 19 minutes East, along the Southeast line of U.S. Highway No. 59, a distance of 2,892.44 feet to a point in the East line of Lot 29, same being the West line of Lot 27 Rosenberg Farms and a corner of the City Limits of the City of Rosenberg, Texas for a corner;

The general nature of the work proposed to be done at this time by and within said District is the acquisition, purchase, construction, installation, improvement, maintenance and operation of a waterworks system for domestic and commercial purposes, and the purchase, construction, acquisition, ownership, operation, repairing, improving and extending of a sanitary sewer system.

VI.

There is a necessity for the organization of said District and the improvements which it is proposed said District shall make for the reason that the territory to be included has been and will be developed for residential purposes, and there is now no adequate source or supply or fresh water within such territory

or adequate sanitary sewer system serving such territory and the present and future inhabitants of the territory to be included in the proposed District are without a proper, adequate and sufficient method of supplying and distributing fresh water or collecting and disposing of domestic, industrial and communal wastes; and the health and welfare of said present and future inhabitants require the construction and operation of such adequate water system for the distribution of pure water for domestic and commercial purposes, and require the construction and operation of an adequate sanitary sewer system for the collection, transportation, processing, disposal and control of all domestic, industrial and communal wastes in such District.

#### VII.

Said proposed improvements are feasible, in that there is available to the proposed District a supply of pure subterranean water, and the terrain of said territory is of such a nature that a waterworks system and sanitary sewer system can be purchased and constructed at a reasonable cost, and it is believed that the present and future residents of said area will contract with said District for the distribution of an adequate supply of water upon the premises owned by them and will contract with said District for said sanitary sewer system; and that said territory can be rapidly developed as a residential section.

The sum of One Hundred Dollars (\$100) has been deposited with the County Clerk to cover expenses incident to the hearing and the election for the creation of said District, as provided by law.

WHEREFORE, the undersigned respectfully pray that this petition be properly filed as provided by law and that the Honorable Commissioners' Court of Fort Bend County, if it be in session, and if not, then the Honorable County Judge of Fort Bend County, set this petition for hearing at such time and place as said Commissioners' Court or County Judge shall deem proper, but not less than fifteen nor more than thirty days thereafter; that the County Clerk be directed to issue notice of such time and place of hearing and that said notice shall inform all persons of their right to appear and contest the form and allegations of said petition and the necessity or feasibility of such project and the benefits to accrue to the land situated therein, and that said notice be given as required by law; that said hearing be held and if upon such hearing it be found that said petition sets forth and conforms to the requirements of law, and that such project is feasible and
